 - Successfully co-led merger of African American Pentecostal Universalist congregation which increased racial diversity of this historically white church from 3 people of color to around 150 people of color, nearly overnight. Developed a visioning process, affinity groups, diversity council, leadership/spiritual development program, differentiated worship services, and combined service and social opportunities.
 - Lead ministerial/intern training and supervision process which included support in worship planning, sermon writing, memorial service training, and eulogy creation, marriage ceremony planning and creation, pastoral care processes and support including end of life, understanding professional boundaries, and navigating the large church system.
 - Actively officiated at over 100 memorial services and supported many more members in their dying process.
 - Designed and facilitated member culturally competent leadership development program
 - Designed and coordinated small group ministry program including content and process training for group leaders for 20+ listening circles coordinated by zip code and facilitated leader circle.
